

# Very Merry Wall Quilt

## Fabric Requirements

- ¼ yard red prints, variety
- ¼ yard green prints, variety  
can use fat quarters
- Fat quarter pink fabric
- ½ yard white background fabric
- ¼ yard binding fabric
- 1 yard backing

## General Instructions

- All Seams ¼"
- Finished Size 24" square
- Press all seams open if possible
- Read all instructions first
- Have Fun!
- Listen to Christmas Music while sewing

# Cutting Guide

Red print  
Cut (8) 2 ½" x 6 ½"

Green print  
Cut (8) 2 ½" x 6 ½"

Red print  
Cut (8) 2 ½" x 4 ½"

Green print  
Cut (8) 2 ½" x 4 ½"

Pink print  
Cut (16) 2 ½" x 2 ½"

White Background  
Cut (16) 2 ½" x 4 ½"

White Background  
Cut (48) 2 ½" x 2 ½"

## Assemble the Block



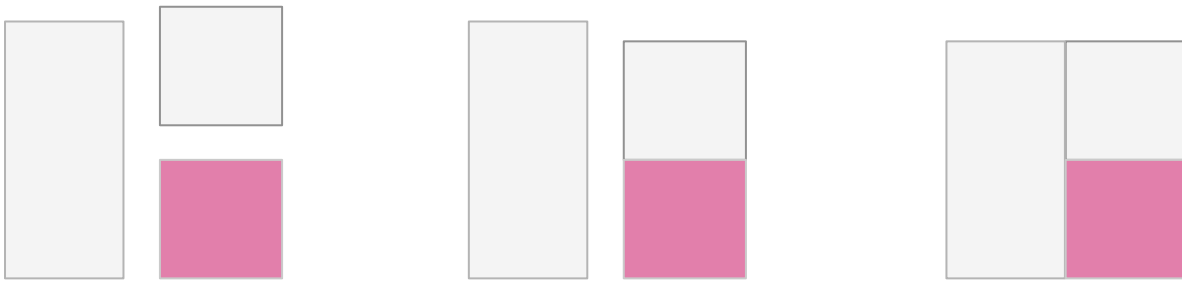
Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 32 white 2 ½" squares. Position a white square on a 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle, as pictured *left*. Sew on the diagonal line. Trim ¼" away from the seam and press open. Make 8 red and 8 green.



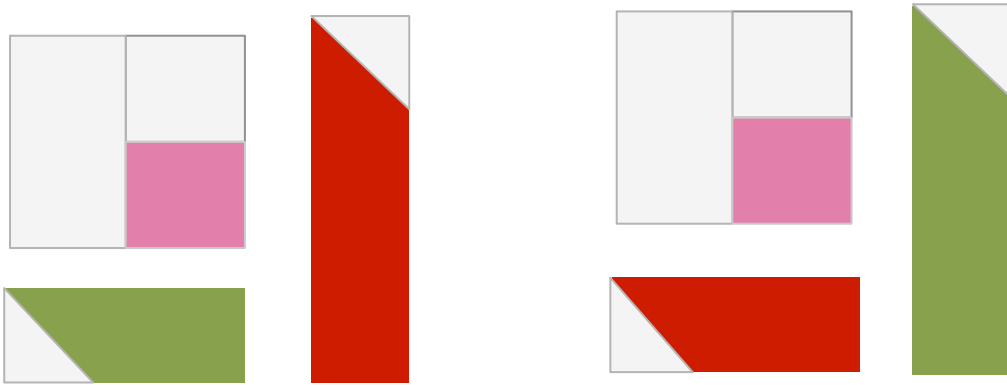
Follow the same instructions as above only with the 4 ½" rectangles. **Make sure to notice the angle is different.** Make 8 red and 8 green.

*(I messed up on a few of mine because I wasn't paying attention!)*

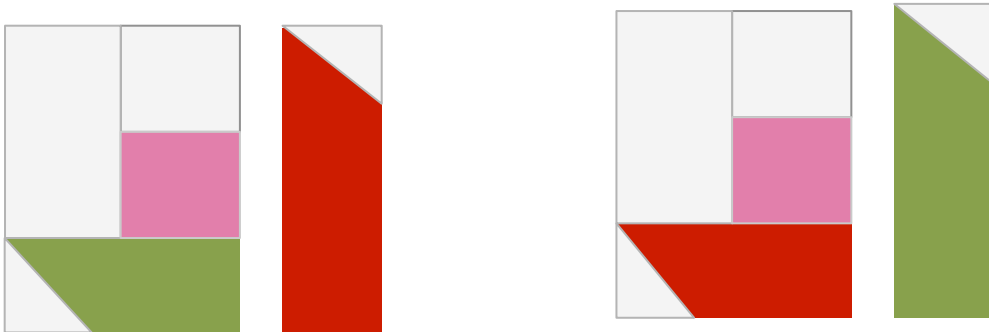




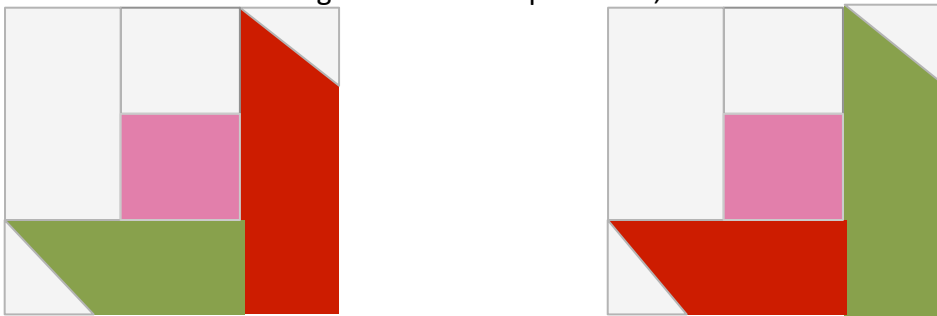
Sew a pink 2 1/2" square to a white 2 1/2" square. Press.  
 Sew the white 4 1/2" rectangle to the side, as pictured. Press.  
 Make 16 of these units.



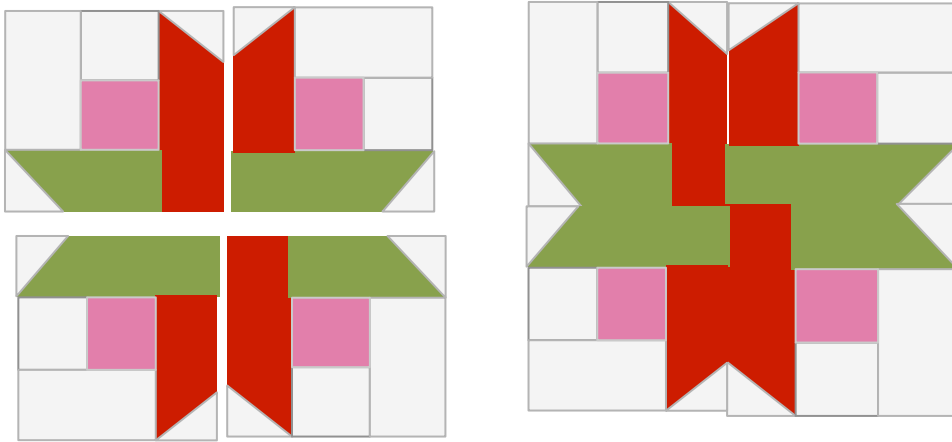
Lay out the units as pictured above, noting the 2 color variations.



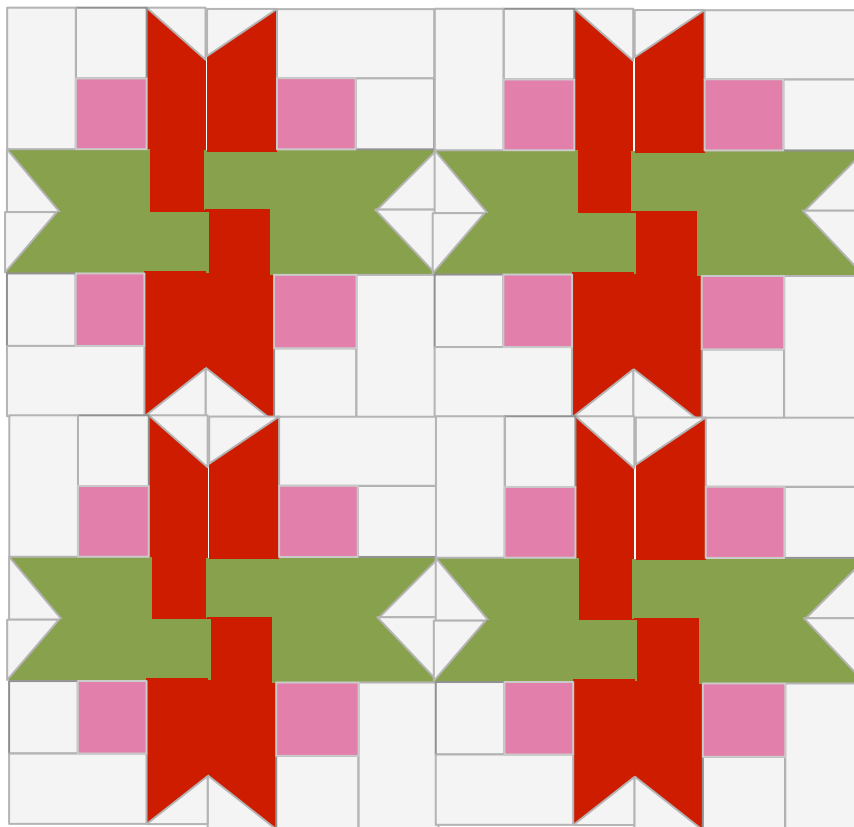
Sew the bottom rectangle unit to the square unit, *above*. Press.



Sew the final rectangle unit. Press. Make 8 of each style.



Take 2 units of each style and lay them out as pictured above.  
Sew them as you would a 4-patch. Press seams open



Sew the 4 blocks together as a 4-patch.  
Press seams open.  
Be sure to match seams and watch out for the points.

Applique a tree or other motif in the center, if desired.  
I used my Sizzix Fabi and die cut a Christmas Tree. I used Heat n Bond Lite to applique the tree and stitched around the tree with a straight stitch.

Baste, Quilt, Bind, Hang.
