Ponderosa Pines

Finished Size: 50 x 61"



Required Material:

20 – 10" Squares in a variety of green colors (for the trees)

20 – 10" Light Squares (for the background)

1/8 yard brown (for the tree trunks)

1/8 yard green for cornerstones (or use scraps from tree appliques)

5/8 yard sashing

Border: 1 yard

Binding: 1/2 yard

Backing: 3 1/4 yards

Cutting instructions

- For the tree trunks, cut 1 @ 2" WOF. Sub-cut into 20 @ 1 ¼" x 2".
- Using the template for the tree below, cut out 20 trees from your assorted green fabrics.
- Sashing: cut 2 @ 10" WOF. Sub-cut into 49 @ 1 ¼" by 10".
- Cornerstones: cut 2 @ 1 ¼" WOF. Sub-cut into 49 @ 1 ¼" square. *Optional: you can use your scraps leftover from cutting the tree appliques for your cornerstones!*

Applique Instructions

Line up bottom edge of the trunk with the edge of the background, and the bottom of the tree 1 ½" up from the bottom edge of the background. Pin and glue baste (we use Quilter's Choice Basting Glue) tree and trunk onto the background. Place a sheet of stabilizer of your choice (we use newsprint or Stitch n' Tear) under your whole background. Stitch all the way around the raw edge of the tree and trunk – zig zag, blanket stitch, straight narrow edge stitch, etc.) Tear away or remove the stabilizer. Repeat with all 20 tree blocks.

Assembly:

Sew a row of alternating cornerstones and sashing with 4 sashing pieces and 5 cornerstone pieces as shown below. Make 6 of these sashing/cornerstone strips.

Sew 4 tree blocks and 5 sashings together in a row as shown below. Make 5 of these tree rows:

Sew your rows together into your quilt top:



Border Instructions

Cut border fabric 6 @ 5" WOF and stitch around all 4 sides of your quilt.
Quilt, bind, and enjoy!
